OUR MISSION AND AIM

OUR PURPOSE

At the Social Change Nest, we are confident that the tools and resources needed to make social change are within reach, and through the Community Nest, we want to make them more visible and accessible. We also want to equip groups with skills to help them move forward and provide the opportunity to learn, both from us and from others in our network.

OUR PLAN

With the help of City Bridge Trust, over the next few years, we'll seek to understand the needs and strengths of the changemakers we work with and offer practical learning.

We'll create opportunities for connection and skill sharing, knowing that building a network means strengthening resilience and sustainability. We'll lean on friends who have expertise in relevant topics, inviting them to share knowledge and offer practical advice. While doing this, we'll be building an empowered community that is rooted in solidarity, because change happens from the ground up, but we know how hard it is to make an impact. We believe change happens by working together.

OUR PEOPLE

We work with over 600 civil society groups that advocate for a range of causes. You can get a feel for some of their projects on <u>our Open Collective page</u>.

Most groups are servicing a range of community needs. Many have a focus on health & wellbeing, climate, racial activism or mutual aid. Activities include community organising, campaigning, education, workshops, emergency support, and more. When asked, the most pressing needs of our network were around raising funds, managing people, and developing strategies, and we want to address this and provide support.

HOW YOU CAN HELP
